White Pine (*Pinus strobus*)



NY native, fast growing, 40-150' tall. Tolerates many soil types, semi-shaded & wet areas. Takes 5-8 years for Christmas trees but needs pruning.

Long lived.

Moderate growth rate, 35-130' tall. Prefers average, light, moist soils. Takes 8-12 years for Christmas trees but short needles drop quickly after cutting.

White Cedar (American Arborvitae) (*Thuja occidentalis*)



NY native. Slow growing, 25-50' tall. Best grown in high lime, nutrient rich soils & on moist to wet sites.

White Spruce (*Picea glauca*)



NY native, slow growing 30-100' tall. Will grow on a variety of soils, has a higher demand for soil fertility than other common conifers. Used for reforestation and takes 8-12 years for Christmas trees.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*)



Grows from 40-100'. Prefers to be grown in deep, rich, well drained, moist, loamy soils; however, it won't do well in wet, heavy, clay soils most years.

Austrian Pine (*Pinus nigra*)

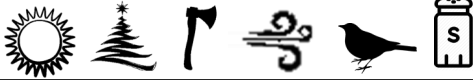


Grows 60-120', moderate growth rate. Similar to native pine, but 4-6" needles are straighter & stiffer. Rugged, grows on dry, poor clay or sandy soil.

Scotch Pine (*Pinus sylvestris*)

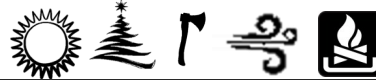


Fast growing, 30-110'. Tolerates many soil types but requires full sun. Takes 5-7 years for Christmas trees but needs shaping & pruning.

Red Pine (*Pinus resinosa*)



NY native. Important timber tree, fast growing, 30-80'. Has reddish-brown bark. Prefers dry, sandy, acidic soils. More disease resistant than white pine.

Fraser Fir (*Abies fraseri*)



Grows 20-70' tall at an average growth rate. Requires cool, moist, well-drained soils. Not tolerant of wet, heavy, clay soils, tolerates some shade. Takes 8-12 years for Christmas trees.

Balsam Fir (*Abies balsamea*)



NY Native. A cold climate tree. Slow growing, 20-60'. Requires abundant moisture. Does not do well in heavy, wet, clay soils. Popular Christmas tree, takes 8-12 years.

Concolor Fir (White Fir) (*Abies concolor*)



Grows 60-120', moderate growth rate. Similar to native pine, but 4-6" needles are straighter & stiffer. Rugged, grows on dry, poor clay or sandy soil.

Dawn Redwood (*Metasequoia glyptostroboides*)



Prefers well drained, slightly acidic soils but adaptable. Can be hurt by early frost. Grows to 75-100' fast. Fine textured foliage, light to bright green in summer, turning pinkish tan after frost. Deciduous. Once a native tree, direct cousin to Giant Sequoia and Redwood trees. Mainly used as a screen

Tamarack -American Larch (*Larix laricina*)



NY Native. Fast growing, mature trees 50-65' high. Prefers wetter, organic soil conditions than Japanese larch. Does not like dry, droughty soils. Very cold tolerant. Needles are soft, short, light-bluish-green before turning yellow. Deciduous.

Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*)



NY Native, largest cherry tree, growing to 80'. Prefers rich bottom land soil & moist hillsides, but can be found on drier sites. Not tolerant of wet soils or shade. Fruits used by wildlife & people for jam.

Tulip Poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*)



NY Native. Grows straight & fast, 80-100' tall. Small crown has large flowers resembling tulips, appear late May to mid-June. Leaves turn yellow in fall. Prefers moist, well-drained, rich soils in part to full sun

Northern Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*)



NY Native. Long lived & fast growing for an oak, 60-80' tall. Prefers full sun and well-drained, sandy, loamy soils. Wind tolerant.

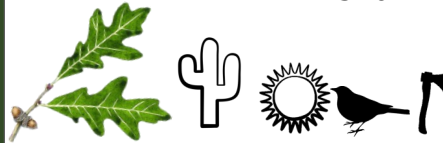


NY Native. Slow growing, 40-80' tall. Grows best on deep, moist, well drained bottom lands in full sun. Ornamentally attractive bark.

Swamp White Oak (*Quercus bicolor*)



NY Native. Grows rapidly to 65-80' tall. Resembles White Oak with shaggier bark. Tolerates wet soils and some flooding.

Sawtooth Oak (*Quercus acutissima*)

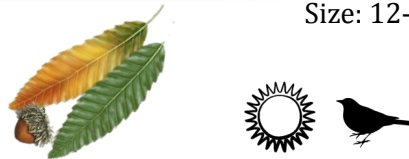


Fast growing, 50-70' tall. Grown in many conditions, but prefers well-drained, acidic soils. Not shade tolerant. Small acorns liked by wild turkeys & ducks.

Butternut (*Juglans cinerea*)



NY Native. Rapid growth, 40-60' tall, short lived, about 75 yrs. Prefers moist fertile soils. Lumber highly rot resistant.

Black Walnut (*Juglans nigra*)



NY native. 35-100' tall. Grows best in moist, well-drained, deep, rich soils.

Sugar Maple (*Acer saccharum*)



NY Native. Prefers moist, rich, well-drained soils. Grows 60-90' tall. Not tolerant of wet areas, prefers well drained loams. . Noted for its brilliant fall colors. It is used for production of maple syrup.

Red Maple (*Acer rubrum*)



NY Native. Not the ornamental red maple. Extremely fast growing, 35-90' tall. Tolerant of many soil conditions including wet, swampy, high lime soils. Tolerant of some shade. Good tree for shade, ornamentally attractive bark. Has red fall colors.

Sycamore (*Platanus occidentalis*)



NY Native. Large tree, growing 90-130' tall. The bark is whitish, exfoliating in flakes to expose a light green surface. A large crown makes this a great shade tree. Prefers moist-well drained soils but is adaptable. Sun to partial shade.

Catalpa (*Catalpa speciosa*)

Native to eastern US. 40-60' tall. Tolerant of different soil conditions, but prefers well-drained soils in full sun. Produces a showy white flower after 7 years or so.

Eastern Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*)



Native to Eastern US. Grows to 30'. Hardy to Zone 4. Adaptable to most medium- fine-textured soils, fairly well-drained. Somewhat shade tolerant. Spring buds are red; showy flowers are reddish-pink in clusters of 4-8 blossoms.

Hack Berry (*Celtis occidentalis*)

NY Native. 40-60' Tall. Tolerant of wet, dry and poor soils, but prefers moist, well drained soils and full sun. Strong shade tree for landscaping. Produces fruit which attract bird and other animals.

Bitternut Hickory (*Carya cordiformis*)



NY native. 50-80' Tall. Prefers moist well drained soils with full sun. Will tolerate low nutrient soils as well. Fruit attracts squirrels and some other animals. Wood can be used for building material and firewood.

Native White Birch (*Betula papyrifera*)



NY Native. Can reach 75' but most will be 30-50'. Short lived, 30-50 yrs. Often planted in clumps of 3-5 for landscaping purposes. Flowers in early spring. Leaves turn yellow after frost. White bark. Adaptable to most soil sites, preferring well-drained sandy loam soils. Grouse and small birds feed on seeds..

Northern Pecan (*Carya illinoensis*)



Grows to 100ft. Wood used for furniture, flooring and smoking meat. Not self-fertile, needs several for pollination. Full sun to light shade. Tolerates most soils except wet sites, tolerates flooding on well drained soils. Nuts are loved by most wildlife.

Northern Apricot (*Prunus armeniaca*)



Grows to 30ft. Tolerant of most soils, prefers moist, well-drained sites with neutral pH. Cold tolerance to -20°F. White flowers tinged with pink in early spring. Fruit ripens in mid to late summer. Fruits used by humans and wildlife.

American Plum (*Prunus americana*)



NY native. Moderate/fast growth to 30'. Grows in part shade to full sun. Adaptable to most soil conditions except very wet or very dry; prefers well-drained, rich, moist soils. Showy white flowers appear in early spring. Edible 1" fruit ripens mid-summer.

Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius*)



NY native. Medium to fast growth rate. 3-10' tall. Prefers moist sandy, loam, clay soils and will tolerate compacted and droughty soil conditions. Is well suited for soil stabilizing on slopes and attracting pollinators such as honey bees.

Filbert/Hazelnut (*Corylus americana*)



NY native. 8-10' tall, often larger around than tall. This multi-stemmed shrub prefers well-drained, loamy soils in full sun to semi shade. Edible nuts ripen Sep-Oct. Nuts consumed by people & wildlife. Great for shrub borders or naturalized areas.

Lilac - Common (*Syringa vulgaris*)



Native to southeast Europe although so common it's considered native in this area. Starts as a single stem but becomes a multi-stemmed thicket. Grows 12-20'. Flowers range from white to pinkish-purple. Adaptable to most soils. Excellent for hedges and screens.

Witch Hazel (*Hamamelis virginiana*)



NY Native. Witch Hazel is a shrub or small tree, typically growing 10-25' tall. Shade tolerant, can grow in most soils. Flowering occurs in late fall with dark yellow petals.

Sargent Crabapple (*Malus sargentii*)



Grows up to 20' tall with a rounded crown. Hardy and disease resistant. White blossoms in spring. Persistent fruit is favorable to wildlife through fall and early winter.

American Cranberry (*Viburnum trilobum*)



NY native. Slow early growth, 8-12' tall. Prefers well-drained, moist soils but can be tolerant. White flowers appear in late May, red fruit in Sept. that persist until spring. Popular food source for song & game birds. Useful as hedges, screens & borders.

American Elderberry (*Sambucus canadensis*)



NY native. Fast growing, 8-10' tall. Tolerant of any fairly fertile, moist soils. White flowers appear in late June followed by ripe, purplish-black edible fruits in Sept. Don't plant near drainage lines or leach beds, roots will plug lines.

NY native. Grows to be 6-12' tall. Relatively disease and insect resistant. Grows in medium, well-drained soils in light shade to full sun. Its fruit attracts various species of wildlife as well.

NEW! Nannyberry (*Viburnum lentago*)



NY native. Medium growth rate. Grows to a mature height of 14-16' tall. Will grow in a wide range of soil texture, moisture and pH. Attractive to birds and other wildlife.

Serviceberry/Juneberry (*Amelanchier canadensis*)



NY native, 10-25' tall. Prefers moist, well-drained soils in full sun to semi-shaded areas. White flowers appear in April, often before the leaves emerge. Purplish-black edible fruits ripen June-July. Wildlife favorite.

Blueberry (*Vaccinium spp.*)



NY native. 12-15' tall. Tolerates most acidic soils, except those with poor drainage. Pinkish-white flowers appear May to June followed by edible blue berries August to September. Fruit used by people & favorite of many birds & mammals. Consider testing your pH and purchasing soil sulfur to lower your soil's pH, see page 8.

Blackberry (*Rubus spp.*)



NY native. 4-6 ft. deciduous shrub produces large, firm, juicy berries over a long period of time. A very hardy, heavy producer. Root system has a great soil-holding capacity. Likes well-drained soil. Space: 4-6ft apart in rows 8-10' apart.

Red Raspberry (*Rubus spp.*)



NY native. Dark green foliage on a 3-5 ft upright shrub, producing large red berries. Blooms late spring; fruit begins to ripen in mid-summer. Fruit used by humans and favorable to wildlife. Will tolerate part shade. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Space 2' apart in rows 10ft apart.

Soil Group Worksheets for Agricultural Assessment

Soil & Water Conservation Districts in New York State are responsible for developing the soil group worksheet, which is the basis for agricultural assessment. The soil group worksheet identifies all of the soil types on a parcel of land that supports agriculture, and how many acres of each soil type. New York State has ranked each soil type based on its agricultural productivity, this ranking can change over time. The agricultural assessment provides an assessment value based on the soil productivity, which is uniform across New York State. Soils that are more productive are valued higher. This means that your cropland is assessed based on its quality, and not on the value of neighboring properties.

Interested in receiving agricultural assessment on your property?

Your first step is to contact your local assessor to get the process started. Eventually you will be calling your local Soil & Water office for a soil group worksheet. When you call, you will need to provide following information from your tax bill:

* Parcel section, block, and lot number and town

* Full owner name and address

* Acreage that is listed on the tax bill

(Tiarella cordifolia)

One of the best shade-loving natives for creating groundcover and naturalization. Has attractive foliage that is nearly evergreen in mild winters.



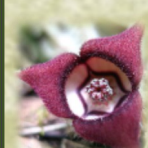
Tiny white or pinkish-white flowers bloom from April through July. Requires well drained, organically rich soils.

Height: 6-12inches, spread: 1-2ft, space: 1ft.



Wild Ginger
(Asarum canadense)

Stemless, heart-shaped basal leaves provide great attractive, low maintenance groundcover for naturalization or rain gardens.



Tiny bell-shaped, purplish flowers bloom from April through June close to ground level. Attracts butterflies. Requires part to full shade, and rich, moist, well drained soil.

Height: 6-12 inches, spread: 12-18 inches, space 10 inches.



Christmas Fern
(Polystichum acrostichoides)

Fountain-shaped, clump-forming evergreen fern that provides winter interest and offers shelter for small wildlife. Grows best in organically rich, dry to medium moisture soils. This fern is more drought tolerant compared to most ferns. Prefers part shade to full shade. Provides striking contrast against flowering perennials.

Height : 1-2 ft, spread: 1-2ft, space: 1ft.



Blazing Star *(Liatris scariosa)*

An upright, clump-forming, leafy perennial that adds vertical accents to gardens. Great for naturalizing areas and for attracting butterflies, as well as hummingbirds and bees. Fluffy, 1-inch across, reddish-purple flowers bloom August—October. Requires full sun and well drained soils, is drought tolerant. Showy as a cut flower. Height: 2-4ft, spread: 1-2ft, space 1ft.



Virginia Bluebells
(Mertensia virginica)

A sign of spring! An erect, clump-forming perennial that emerges pink buds, which bloom as blue, 1-inch long trumpet-shaped flowers in March through April. The plant goes dormant in the summer. Prefers spring sun and part to full shade in the summer. Requires moist, well-drained soil. Tolerant of rabbits and black walnut trees.



Height 1.5-2ft, spread:1-1.5ft, space1ft.



Indian Pink *(Silene virginica)*

Clump-forming wildflower that blooms brilliant, Scarlett red 2-inch flowers from April to June. A hummingbird favorite. Prefers full sun to part shade, dry to medium-moist, well-drained soils. Is drought tolerant. Height: 1-1.5ft, spread 1-1.5ft, space 12-18 inches.



Turks Cap Lily
(Lilium superbum)

Tallest of all native American lilies. Forms impressive colonies in medium- wet soils, full to part sun. Blooms in July. Flowers open completely, are orange with maroon spots, and showy. Attracts hummingbirds.



Height 4-7ft, spread 6-10 inches, space: 7 inches.
