

#### TAGGING TREES

To allow personalized selection for pick-up or deliveries, trees can be "tagged" for up to 30 days. We will make every attempt to hold these plants, but can't guarantee the tags won't be removed or the items sold. If your customers prefer to choose the stock, you must accompany them. After 30 days, plant material will become available for sale and the tags removed.

#### TERMS OF SALE

We accept cash, checks, and major credit cards unless credit has been established. Call or stop by our sales office for a credit application. The credit application process can take as long as two (2) weeks.

#### CHARGE ACCOUNTS

Upon credit approval, our terms are **Net 10th Prox**. Invoices will be mailed / emailed as incurred on a daily/weekly basis. Statements of account are sent after the 25th of each month. Payment is due on the 10th of the following month. It is understood that a service charge of 1.5% per month, 18% per annum, will be collected on **PAST DUE ACCOUNTS**. If payment is not made by due date on invoices / statements, your charge account will be placed on a C.O.D. basis until such time that your account is brought current or paid in full.

#### **RETURNED-CHECK CHARGE**

A \$50 returned-check charge will be collected on all checks returned for insufficient funds.

#### PRICING

#### **RESTOCKING CHARGE**

We charge a 10% restocking charge for accepted returns. Order carefully—it costs us time and money to handle plants. There is no restocking charge for plants or landscape supplies rejected at time of delivery.

### WILL CALL ORDERS

We are happy to assemble your plant order and set it aside in our will call area for you to pick up. Please give us 24hour notice to pull your order efficiently. Orders in our will call area will be held for 2 weeks from the day the order was assembled; please contact us as soon as possible if there is a delay in picking up your order. Only container products are pulled to will call, but we are happy to tag your B&B and container trees for you. It's wonderful to load and go!

#### CONTAINER-RECYCLING PROGRAM

We proudly accept clean and undamaged plastic containers for recycling. This year we are giving credit toward your account or purchase. We reserve the right to suspend the recycling program at any time.

#### BALL CART RENTAL

We have two sizes of ball carts (1000# & 1600# capacity) available for just \$\_\_\_ a day to place your B & B trees. This is easier on your trees and on your crew. This also gives you a chance to try one before purchasing.

#### JAPANESE BEETLE QUARANTINE

In an effort to contain the spread of Japanese Beetle (JB) across Colorado, our Department of Agriculture has placed a quarantine of untreated plant material outside of the Front Range. Alameda was one of the first Nurseries to comply with the strict guidelines to become Quarantine Compliant, allowing us to ship plant material anywhere in Colorado. Alameda excels at buying quality plant material from only JB compliant growers. As a responsible friend to the environment, we love bees and other pollinators and use insect control in a response(BEE) way.

## DELIVERY SERVICE—CURBSIDE


To help you save valuable time, we can deliver all of your landscape supplies directly to your job site. We normally can deliver throughout metro Denver with 48-hours notice. Deliveries not meeting the minimum order can be delivered as time permits for \$\_\_\_ in the metro area. We use our own trucks, drivers, and helpers. Our trained staff will let you know at the time you place your order if there is any problem in selecting the quality of plants you deserve. If any stock does not meet your standards, simply return it with our driver. **Please inform us if you will need to rent a ball cart or use a boom truck.** 

#### **BOOM TRUCKS**

Having a problem deciding how to plant a tree in an established yard? Normally, we unload deliveries in one location. However, with advance notice and \$\_\_\_ per hour above the normal delivery charge, we can set B & B trees up to 2,000 lbs. as far as 18 feet from our truck. Our trucks can handle 18-20 foot spruce and ponderosa easily.

# WHY TREE DIVERSITY IS IMPORTANT


I is common to have a row of trees in a landscape that are all the same variety and the same size. This creates the possibility of several problems. In Colorado trees don't grow identically, some might get less or more water, some might be in better soil, etc. If just one of these trees dies it is nearly impossible to find an identical replacement. A monoculture of trees increases the vulnerability to severe weather events; an early or late drastic freeze, an insect or disease killing or injuring some if not all the plantings.

In the 1800's Chestnut trees were the dominate tree in the Northeast when blight hit and devastated the population. When was the last time you had Chestnuts roasted over an open fire like the Christmas carol? In the 1960's Dutch Elm Disease hit and currently Emerald Ash Borer is present in the Denver metro area.

We are fortunate in Denver to have many varieties of trees to choose from. By using trees from different families (varieties) you will reduce the risk while at the same time increase the interest in the landscape with different textures, fall colors, bloom times, and leaf color. The more diverse our urban forests, the more resilient they will be to devastating pests, diseases and severe weather.





### TREE WATERING GUIDELINES

We are frequently asked "How much water does a tree need?" so we hope the following information is helpful to you and your customers. Soil textures, ranging from sand to heavy clay, weather conditions and water application methods all factor in to determining tree water requirements. Generally, our trees need a minimum of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  - 5 gallons of water per week to survive during the growing season.

The best test of soil moisture is pull back the mulch and geotextile; use a soil knife carefully dig down about 6" deep to ascertain the moisture content. A soil probe can also be used to obtain a deeper core sample at the edge of the root ball. If the soil does not form a ball when squeezed in you hand, it needs water. If it makes a moist ball easily, hold off on watering. The soil should resemble a nice chocolate brownie texture when the soil has adequate moisture. It is important to remember that plant roots need oxygen as well as water; over watering drives air out of the soil causing the plant to stress. Over watering is usually caused by frequency, not the quantity, of water. It is always best to water less frequently for longer periods of time. It is beneficial to run the irrigation system in two consecutive cycles with a short rest in between; this practice allows the water to soak into the soil deeper and efficiently.

## During periods of drought and water restrictions:


A general rule is to use approximately 10 gallons of water per inch of trunk diameter. To calculate amount of water per tree, measure trunk at knee height:

Tree Diameter x 5 minutes= Total Watering Time

A standard garden hose at medium pressure delivers 10 gallons of water in 5 minutes. For example, a 4" diameter tree should receive 40 gallons of water – multiply by 5 minutes to equal total watering time of 20 minutes. Deep watering to a depth of 12 inches below soil surface and saturate the soil within the drip line of the branches to disperse water deeply to the roots. For evergreens, water 3-5 feet beyond the drip line on all sides.

Fall and winter watering of all plants is extremely important! Tree roots continue to grow throughout the winter and need moisture to survive. Our winters are often cold, dry and windy causing soil to dry out quickly and plants experience drought stress. Water all plants one or two times per month October through March on a day when outdoor temperatures are above 40° F and the ground is not frozen. Use the same amount of water as outlined above. Your trees and plants will greatly appreciate this extra attention and reward you in the spring with healthy growth and endless beauty.

## The history of ALAMEDA WHOLESALE

Stanley Brown Sr., our firm's founder, started working for Marshall Nurseries in Arlington, Nebraska in 1925 at the age of 14. After working up to a landscape foreman he had the responsibility of planting the designs of Gloria Rapp, who had started her studies at Doane College in Nebraska, and later graduated from Iowa State at Ames with a degree in Landscape Architecture. Stan and Gloria were married November 2, 1940, and moved to Denver the following month, where they would begin work on the lawns and landscaping for the Lincoln Park Housing Project, and later start a branch of Marshall Nurseries in the spring of 1941.

In 1944 Stan left Marshall's and bought one square block at the edge of town on a beaten gravel road (now known as West Alameda Avenue and Canosa Court), and with the help of a partner, Gilbert Pike, Stan Brown Sr. opened a retail nursery and garden center. The partnership ended after a year, but the tiny business continued to grow and prosper, with considerable credit going to the inventiveness, creativity, and introduction of new concepts to Denver such as packaged peat moss, African Violet soil, and a liquid fertilizer truck for residential turf (called "Green Rain," it proved to be 30 years too soon). In 1950 Mount Arbor Nursery sent a double order of Paul Scarlet roses, so Stan bought tar-paper pots from Hasler Nursery in Kansas City, and was the first nursery in the state to begin containergrown roses, and later container-grown trees and shrubs in 5-gallon egg cans collected from local bakeries.

In 1957 a farm at West Dartmouth Avenue and South Zuni Street was purchased to be the growing field for "Denver's Garden Center" as it was then advertised. In 1962 the property on West Alameda was sold and the garden center and nursery were moved to 3160 S. Zuni St. After the flood of 1965 the retail end of our business was dropped in order to concentrate on wholesaling. The drop in volume was significant, but the nursery struggled through with the idea that there was enough business in supplying plants to landscapers and garden centers.

Stan Brown Jr. joined the business after leaving Colorado State University in 1964 to work full time, and later was joined by his brother Arnold after he left IBM in 1969. The two sons worked their way up through the nursery and eventually purchased the business from their father in 1975. Stan Sr., Stan Jr. and Steve have served as presidents of the Colorado Nurserymen's Association, and Stan Jr. has served as Denver Chapter president and state board president of the Associated Landscape Contractors of Colorado.

In 1992 Stan Brown Sr. passed away. In 1993 the nursery moved to 1950 W. Dartmouth Ave., doubling the amount of land available.


