Deer in Nara Park

Stoutest in the Park! Japanese Black Pine (Pinus thunbergii)

Trunk girth 354cm Height 28m Est. Age 250 years



Many Japanese black pines (*Pinus thunbergii*) are planted in the park, but this is the stoutest!
The people who planted this tree 250 years ago would be proud to see how big it has grown.

Beautiful Lilac Flowers in Early Summer Chinaberry (Melia azedarach)

Trunk girth 450cm Height 20m Est. Age Unknown



In ancient time, Chinaberry trees (Melia azedarach) were planted in the graveyards to chase away evil. In the middle of May, many lilac flowers bloom.

Planted in honor of Emperor Meiji Camphor Trees

(Cinnamomum camphora)
Trunkgirth 480cm
Height 26m
Est. Age 140 years



These three closely planted camphor trees (*Cinnamomum camphora*) mark the spot where Emperor Meiji watched army exercises in 1908. They are still growing vigorously.

Japanese hackberry trees (*Celtis sinensis* var. *japonica*) were popularly planted as milestones, since they can be easily seen from far away. A bench is prepared for you, so relax and imagine how many people went by under this tree.

Historic Survivor! Nagi (Podocarpus nagi) Trunk girth 330cm Height 13m Est. Age over 500 years



This conifer, called "Nagi" (*Podocarpus nagi*) has leaves unlike most conifers. It grows very slowly, but is already over 500 years old!
