#### **C**rnamental Characteristics

Size: Tree > 30 feet
Height: 30' - 50'
Leaves: Evergreen
Shape: pyramidal to rounded; spreading with age
Ornamental Other: Branch up with age to reveal mottled color bark.

#### Environmental Characteristics

Light: Full sun Hardy To Zone: 5a Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0) Environmental Other: Full sun required. Will not tolerate poor drainage.

#### Insect Disease

Those commonly associated with the *Pinus* genus such as rusts, borers, cankers, aphids, scales, sawflies, webworm.

### Cultivars for Pinus bungeana

Cultivar Name	Notes
Compacta	'Compacta' - dwarf form; grows more slowly than the species with the same striking bark
Rowe Arboretum	'Rowe Arboretum' - uniform growth habit; branch structure denser and neater
Diamant	'Diamant' - dwarf, globe-shaped form; short, fine needles that spiral around narrow stems
Dwarf Fairway	'Dwarf Fairway' - upright, dwarf form; multiple trunks; grows about 6 inches a year; grows to 30 - 40' x 15 - 20'; slow growth rate
Silver Ghost	'Silver Ghost' - upright form; mottled, exfoliating bark with large portions colored in silver; grows to 6' tall x 3' wide in 10 years; hardy to -30 degrees
Temple Gem	'Temple Gem' - slow-growing; broad upright form; rich emerald-green needles; grows to 5' tall x 3' wide in 10 years; hardy to -30 degrees
