Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Tree > 30 feet, Tree < 30 feet

Height: 40' - 50' (10' - 20' spread)

Leaves: Evergreen

Shape: narrowly columnar

Light: Full sun

Hardy To Zone: 5a

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to neutral soil (pH 5.0 to 7.4)

Environmental Other: Could replace yew or juniper on wet sites

Cultivar Name	Notes
Andelyensis	'Andelyensis' - compact; slow-growing
Ericoides	'Ericoides' - common; blue-green foliage
Red Star	'Red Star' (a.k.a. 'Rubicon') - compact, dense, somewhat columnar growth; blue-green foliage that turns red or purple in winter
Top Point	'Top Point' - dwarf, growing only 3" per year, reaching only four feet at maturity; blue foliage
Glauca Pendula	'Glauca Pendula' - bluish foliage; pendulous branches; open spreading habit
Shiva	'Shiva' - dwarf, rounded, pyramidal form grows to 5-8' tall and to 3-5' wide; soft blue-green to gray-green foliage that acquires brown tones in winter
Heatherbun	'Heatherbun' - dwarf rounded habit; grows 6-8' tall and to 4-5' wide; medium green foliage turns an attractive heather purple to plum purple in winter
Little Jaime	'Little Jaime' - rounded conical form; dwarf, slow-growing, 2 - 3' wide by 3 - 4' ft tall; bluish-green summer and plum-colored winter foliage
Aurea	'Aurea' - dense conical-shaped shrub; to 15'; bronze-yellow foliage in winter; bright yellow foliage in summer
Hopkinton	'Hopkinton' - faster growing form than species; blue-gray foliage; narrow habit; 15' high in 10 years; 35' at maturity
